Students must establish oral communication competency to complete degree requirements either by passing a SPCH 110 competency examination or taking SPCH 110.

Additional Requirements for the Associate of Arts in Performing Arts (music concentration)

Music Majors will perform a sophomore (fourth semester) solo recital.

Music Majors are required to pass the Piano Proficiency Exam. Students typically enroll in MUSC 299 – Piano Proficiency in their fourth semester of piano study in conjunction with their applied piano course. Students must earn a grade of “S” in MUSC 299 – Piano Proficiency. _____

Music Majors are required to perform in student recitals each semester. This includes the applied instruments for which they are enrolled other than their primary instrument.

Music Majors are required to take a music theory placement exam prior to enrolling in MUSC 122- Music Theory I for proper advising in the music theory sequence.

Students whose major instrument is piano, guitar or electric bass are also required to perform in a primary ensemble (Concert Choir or Concert Winds). A music advisor will assist in selecting the appropriate ensemble for these students.
