If the student resigns or does not enroll for one semester, the student would have to meet the requirements of a new curriculum.

The student is responsible with all the requirements of the degree program and should consult with his/her academic advisor regularly. Each student assumes the responsibility for scheduling courses which are applicable to degrees and for taking courses in proper sequence to ensure the orderly progression of work.

**This certificate is a “stackable” certificate, allowing the student to continue studies to complete the Associate of Applied Science in Criminal Justice Degree.**

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### **POST Certification credits Applied to Criminal Justice Degree**
